## **He's Got The Whole World In His Hands** **Report: The Fuqua World Trip**

There has never been a time in my life that I have been any more convinced that “God Almighty Reigns.” On September 14, Chris and I left on a trip to visit ministries all over the world. In going around the world, it became so obvious that there are millions and even billions of people that we have the responsibility to reach with the good news of Jesus Christ. Seeing lands that I have only read about in books and seen in National Geographic videos truly heightened my awareness of God. It was so great to have quiet times in lands all around the world. These people look into the same heavens. To know that God is in control and that he loves these people just as much as he loves the people that I have grown up with is an incredible thought.

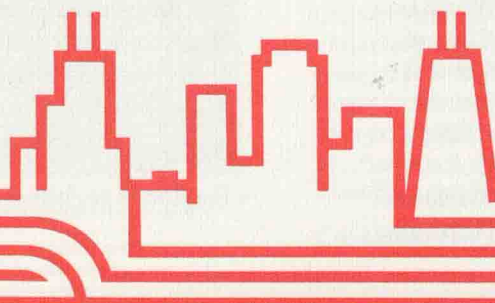
Isaiah 2:2 states, “On the last day God will raise up the mountain of the Lord’s temple to be established as chief among the mountains. It will be raised above the hills and all nations will stream into it.” It is inspiring to know through the eyes of faith that all the lands that we saw will be captured for the glory of God in our lifetime.

The first congregation we visited was in Sydney, Australia. This was the first church planting effort from the London Church of Christ. It was a reconstruction of the work begun by Mike and Terry Fontenot several years before. While Mike and Terry had moved to London for further training, Chris and Jackie McGrath were sent from London to be the lead Evangelist and Women’s Counselor. This great congregation was a wonderful mixture of older and younger Australians. During my Wednesday night speech I noted one interesting language difference—many of the locals use the term “Fair dinkum” instead of “Amen.”

This congregation is looking forward to having over 200 baptisms this year, which is the second year of the work. Some of their future mission points are Melbourne, Perth, and Brisbane, in Australia, and Auckland, New Zealand. Their desire is to reach all of Australia as well as Oceania, all of the different island nations in that area of the world. It was so encouraging to be able to share with them the things that are going on through the Chicago congregation with “Operation Saturation” in reaching the area of the world that we live in. Our prayers are with our brothers and sisters in Sydney as they conquer their region for Christ. Fair dinkum!

Our second stop was Bombay, India. Bombay is, of course, the work that we in Chicago are financially supporting. The excitement of being in Bombay with the brothers and sisters was beyond description! I mentioned to one of the brothers in the congregation that I wished every single member of the Chicago church could be in India to see all that we saw and experienced. We arrived in Bombay at 1:00 a.m. The first thing that one notices getting out of the airport is the aroma of Bombay. We arrived there just after the monsoon season, so it was sort of a mixture of mildew and sewage—a strong, pungent odor. In talking to Kip after the trip, he asked me what I thought of Bombay, and I said it was “visually overloading.” Everywhere you looked you saw things that struck you as amazingly different than the experiences that one would have in Chicago or the United States. Poverty is everywhere. You see the results of thousands upon thousands of people living together in a very crowded space. The commuter trains are stuffed beyond belief with people even hanging onto the outside of trains. You see beggars, children, invalids—people everywhere! We were there, interestingly enough, the weekend of the Hindu festival dedicated to the idol Ganesh. Saturday night was the high point of the festival—we saw the pagan revelry in all of its ungodliness. I will never forget the sadness of seeing such blatant idolatry. India is in dire need of Jesus Christ!

## Report: 1988 Midwest Women's Retreat "Increase Our Faith"

*"I tell you the truth, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain 'Move from here to there' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you." —Matthew 17:20-21*

Last weekend's retreat was **the** most exciting event in the history of the women's ministry here in Chicago. God truly blessed us with victory after victory. Here were some of the highlights:

**FRIDAY NIGHT**— 350 women gathered in the Regency Ballroom for the Leadership Night. The crowd included Women's Counselors, Zone Leaders, Bible Talk Leaders and Assistants, as well as several young Christian leaders of the future. The women cheered as Lauri Parson was appointed Women's Counselor. She is doing a great job in Milwaukee and challenged us all to quit making excuses for why we cannot rise up and lead. Doug Arthur, Pat and Rob Gempel, and Marty Fuqua then shared a terrific panel discussion time on the subjects: Missions, Finances, Family and Leadership. We closed out with Pat Gempel speaking on "According To Your Faith, It Will Be Done."

I want to express my appreciation to all of these awesome men and women for making Friday night an inspirational time for us all. You are truly our heroes in the faith. I especially want to thank Pat for the tremendous impact she has had on my life and the entire Midwest/Canadian womens' ministries. You have called us higher and shown us how to get there. I love you.

**SATURDAY**— When we began planning this year's retreat, I had two goals: 1) To increase our faith to have an impact on our area of the Midwestern United States and Canada, and 2) To tie the Chicago women tight emotionally and spiritually with the mission works in India. God blessed us abundantly in both areas. We had hoped, by faith, to have 1,200 women in attendance on Saturday. The Regency Ballroom was so packed for the first speech that we had to move to the larger Grand Ballroom for the close-out session. God increased our faith as over 1,300 women gathered for the retreat.

It was a real joy to have Joyce Arthur, one of my closest friends, with us as our keynote speaker this year. Joyce and her husband, Douglas, dynamically lead the London church as well as oversee the mission works going on in India. Joyce made such an impact on each and every heart in her speeches. Many were moved to tears during her luncheon talk on faith and deeds, as she shared about the need for God and for our money in India. Then we were moved to give as we blew out our \$12,000 contribution goal by collecting over \$20,000 to hire women interns in India! To God be the glory! Thank you, Joyce, for being with us and giving so much of yourself. Your impact is being felt all over the world.

A word of final thanks to all who visited, participated, taught and organized. We praise God for the way he helped our "mustard seed faith" move mountains for the kingdom this past weekend.

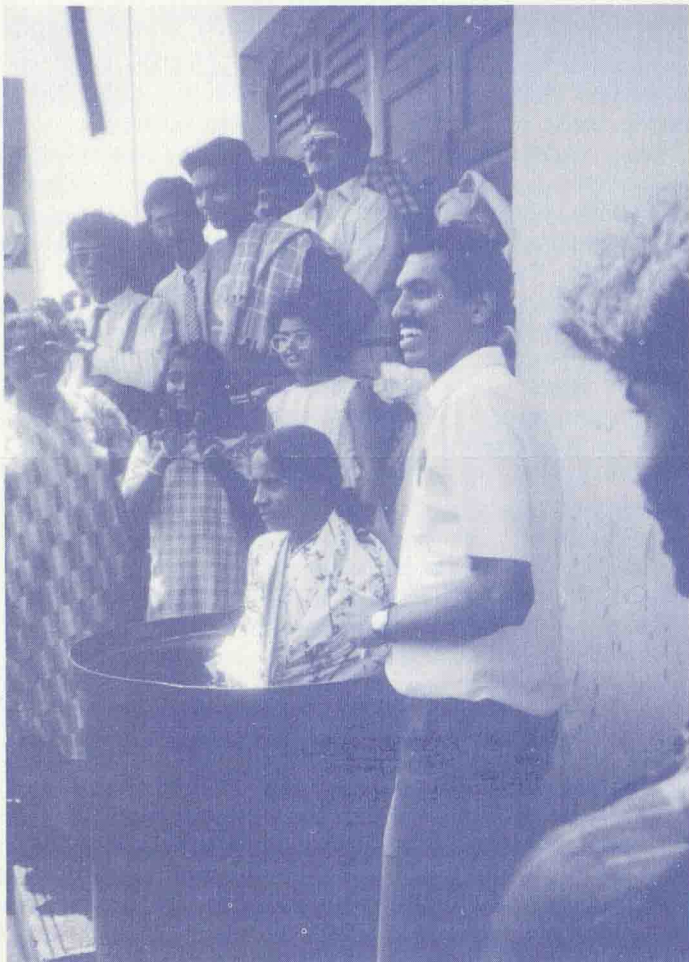

Jim and Donna Blough and Greg and Shelly Metten are leading the Bombay church and are doing an awesome job. They expect to have over 150 baptisms in their second year! While most of Bombay was partying with Ganesh, the Christians from Bombay and Bangalore were gathering for the first "All-India Retreat." It was a joy to see the brothers and sisters from America and London, but the highlight was seeing how the young Indian leaders are quickly rising to lead. It was great to be with Mohan Nanjundan, an Indian man who was converted several years earlier in London and is now back in his native country. On Saturday night of the program it was so inspiring to hear Mohan speak on the theme "I Was Born a Citizen." It was so challenging to the Indians to see their responsibility that their fellow citizens come to know the Lord. Even as he spoke, many of the Indians were making their plans to go on church plantings to Madras, New Dehli, and Calcutta. It was thrilling to think that in the next few years there will be multiplying congregations in all of the five major cities of India, and on from there to the thousands upon thousands of towns and villages. It's amazing to

consider that India has 800 million people, and by comparison, the United States has only 245 million. Being with the Indian brothers and sisters was so encouraging because of their enthusiasm and their joy. My faith has never been greater that we will see the world evangelized. What a privilege it is for us to be able to give financially to this great work!

Next, we flew from Bombay to London with the Arthurs. Of course, the London Church of Christ is well known to us because the Chicago congregation was planted by the Boston church at about the same time. It is now the largest Church of Christ outside of the borders of the United States. They have been able to plant four churches: Sydney, Australia; Singapore, Malaysia; Bangalore, India; and Birmingham, England. Chris and I met with the leaders and were able to share many things with them. We felt right at home. London, like us, has sent out many of their older leaders to their church plantings. Their current zone leaders are

younger, but like ours in Chicago, they are filled with much zeal and joy. This congregation has done a great job in raising up leaders who have been converted in London and their spirit of aggressive evangelism has been an example for the whole brotherhood. The congregation is being led by Doug and Vicki Jacoby, as well as the Arthurs, and by their young evangelist Fred Scott who was converted while a college student in London. Some of their future mission points are the remainder of the United Kingdom (including Manchester, England and Edinburgh, Scotland) as well as several places in Africa.

During our stay we took a day trip from London up to Birmingham, their church planting further north in Great Britain. This was the first domestic church planting from London. We took a two-hour train ride up with Doug and Vicki Jacoby and had a great time of fellowship with them. This congregation is being supported financially by our sister congregation in Indianapolis. The Birmingham church is led by Tim and Siobhan Dannett. I spoke on Wednesday night to the congregation of about 85, many of them converted in the past year! It reminded me so much of our church plantings—they are young, enthusiastic, and they love the Lord deeply. In the first 12 months they will have well over 100 people baptized. How exciting to see Great Britain being saturated with the gospel!

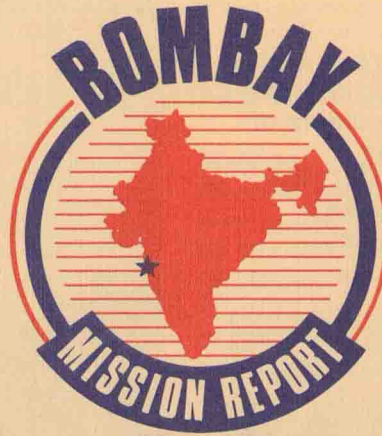
We left England and hopped the channel to Paris. What a beautiful, beautiful city Paris is. It is so historic and has been such a pivotal city in our world for centuries. Sadly though, in our generation, Paris is known as the atheist capital of Europe. As you go through the city,

you see cathedral after cathedral; beautiful massive churches. The reality is that those church buildings are empty. Very, very few people in Paris go to church. Even more importantly, very few people in Paris even believe in the Lord anymore. The Paris Church of Christ is currently being led by Brian and Adrienne Scanlon. Randy and Kay McKean will arrive as soon as they have their visas. We were able to meet with the interns and the evangelists in the work there and were able to encourage them and to inspire them about the things that have gone on in Chicago. We know that God has great victories in store for this congregation! Their mission points are French-speaking Europe and the other French-speaking areas of the world. God is longing for Paris to be the city of true light.

After our time in Paris, we boarded our last flight back home to Chicago. It was great to see John and Nancy Mannel waiting for us at the International Terminal at O'Hare. It was tremendous to be able to fly in over Chicago and renew our vision for this city and the millions of people that live here who need salvation.

Brothers and sisters, it was great to see the world. I was inspired and encouraged about what God is doing. But I believe more than anything else that my journey made me understand more how I love all of you in Chicago. I am so proud of the faith and love that we have had in the past. I am excited to see God is using us to reach Chicago, the Midwest and Canada. We must understand even more how God wants to use us to reach the world. Let us give our very best in the rest of 1988 to see Chicago won for Jesus Christ. He's got the whole world in his hands!

## 1988 ALL-INDIA RETREAT

### Mitibhai College Hall, Bombay

### 24-25 September, 1988

It has been such an exciting year for the India work! With the Bombay church in its second year expecting over 200 baptisms in 1988, and the newly-planted Bangalore church already nearing 100, truly we are seeing an evangelism explosion amongst the largest race of people in the world! We dream of the day when every one of India's 600,000 villages has at least one house church of true disciples of Jesus Christ! May that day come soon!

Many significant events have highlighted the last several months in India, but none has been quite as exciting as the recent FIRST ANNUAL ALL-INDIA RETREAT, held in Bombay September 24-25. At the request of Douglas Arthur, evangelist of the London Church of Christ and director of the India work, the Christians from both the Bombay and the Bangalore churches met in Bombay for a time of fellowship, prayer, and challenge to help prepare for the great task of winning this entire nation for Jesus Christ. Nearly the entire Bangalore church traveled 24 hours by train to Bombay to participate in the retreat. It was a thrilling and inspiring experience to see nearly 225 disciples greet one another for the first time. India will never be the same! A number of the exciting highlights of the retreat are summarized below.

**1. GREAT LOVE—** It was so exciting for people from these two great cities of India who have never met one another to come together in complete unity in Jesus Christ. India as a nation is incredibly splintered and disunified. From the age-old caste system of Hinduism to the recent conflicts in the Punjab and Sri Lanka, even today there are strong barriers between people of different communities, backgrounds and language groups. But in Christ, God has "destroyed the dividing wall of hostility" and created "one new man out of the two, thus making peace" (Eph. 2:15). The Indian brotherhood is incredibly diverse yet completely united in love. The bonds between our brothers and sisters throughout India are now stronger than any

ties with their physical families. Only God can bring about such a change!

**2. GREAT VISION—** Another exciting aspect of the retreat was the repeated emphasis on preparing Indians themselves to take India for Christ. On Saturday evening, Mohan Nanjundan delivered a powerful message on missions entitled, "I Was Born A Citizen". The impact on our Indian Christians was incredible, as young men and women made decisions on the spot to join mission teams to Calcutta (Spring, 1989), Madras (Fall, 1989), and Dehli (Spring, 1990). Of course, sending foreign

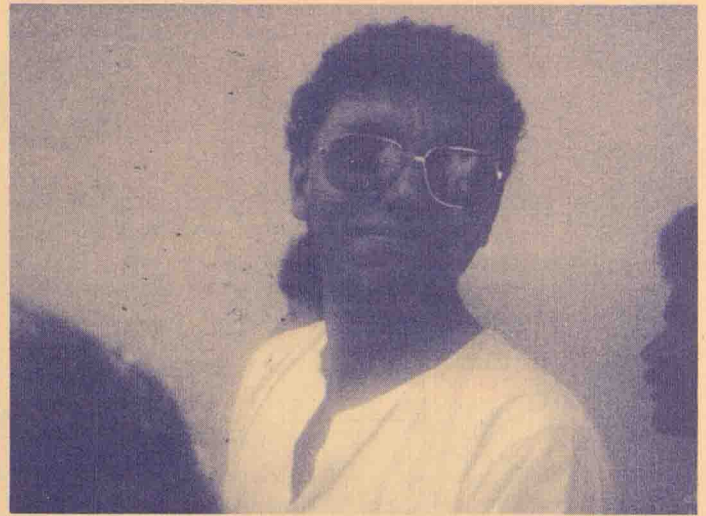

I was asked to be an intern in the Bombay Church of Christ on March 1, 1988, after having worked as a computer programmer in a reputed bank for the previous 14 months. The job in the bank was intense, involved long hours, and entailed serious accountability. When I started working for the church, however, I found out what real intensity, long hours, and accountability were!

I have learned so much in the last six months. These have been the most exciting and challenging days of my life. I praise God for the awesome leadership we have here in Bombay. Godly men such as Mo Adame, Dan Allison, Henry Kriete, and of course Jim Blough, have had a profound and lasting impact on my life. My inward character has been challenged in ways that I never before expected. ## John Mannel Appointed Evangelist

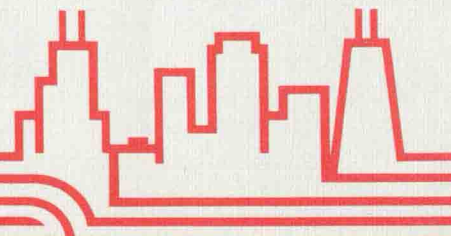
**LOVE CARDS**— can be picked up at the Tape Table. These are invitations to our Sunday worship service at Medinah; they are free.
